#### Dog Issue

The Commissioners have been contacted about a dog pack that is causing problems in the Martindale Road area near the Pasco-Kahlotus Highway. The Department of Fish and Wildlife has been contacted. There are 10 to 12 large dogs. People in the area are nervous about the safety of their kids and about the dogs digging under fences and hurting or killing other animals.

#### PROSECUTOR

Chief Civil Deputy Prosecutor Ryan Verhulp and Attorney Chris Mertens met with the Board.

**Executive Session** at 9:15 a.m. regarding litigation, RCW 42.30.110(1)(i), expected to last 10 minutes. Those present in the audience left the room.

#### Open Session at 9:23 a.m.

Jim Gartside of Transtate, Jim Braithwaite of Steelman & Duff, Michael Parkhill of Selland Construction, John W. Fales of Steelman-Duff, Inc., C\_\_\_ Copenhaver of CCI and Josh Combs of Apollo, Inc., joined the audience.

#### Affordable Housing and Homeless Housing Agreements

Mr. Verhulp has prepared a new Affordable Housing Agreement. He told the Board about some provisions in the agreement. In the new agreement, 5% of the Affordable Housing funds can be used on administrative costs, which is essentially what we pay the Community Action Committee (CAC) to administer the funds. The new

agreement states 5% of the funds collected each month will be paid to the CAC for their fee. The remaining 95% of the funds will be funds that the oversight committee will have authority to administer for affordable housing projects. The current balance of the fund is about \$68,000. The new agreement has strict requirements that the CAC provide detailed invoices every month for costs so we can make sure that 5% of funds we are giving them are for administrative costs. It will allow us to review the invoices and allow for some monitoring of them.

The new Homeless Housing Assistance agreement is similar, extended from January 2007 through December 2011. It states that 6% of funds in that account can be used for administrative costs. There is no oversight committee involved to handle the rest of the funds but the CAC has access to the other 94% of the funds in the account. The other 94% of funds can only be used on program implementation costs, meaning towards homeless housing assistance type of projects, which makes tracking difficult. The new agreement requires CAC to provide us separate invoices for each type of expenditure.

The next piece is a part that wasn't in place in prior agreements. It had been drafted so it could be monitored and the Board approved it last time but it wasn't communicated on to the Auditor or Treasurer's office who would issue vouchers out of those funds. There was no way to monitor the funds. Mr. Verhulp has informed the Auditor and Treasurer of this monitoring requirement. He recommended that whichever Board member works with CAC receive the invoices routinely and that there is some review before the invoices get approved.

A woman joined the audience.

Some other requirements are also set forth. The CAC will be required to give bi-annual oral reports. The Board also has authority to demand that they come in at any time and give an update. The Homeless Housing Assistance fund currently has almost \$400,000. Judith Gidley has already signed these two contracts as CAC director.

Mr. Verhulp has signed the contracts "approved to form."

Motion – Mr. Miller: I move that we accept the contract agreement for Homeless Housing Assistance, Standard Service Agreement between Benton and Franklin County

General Policy and Procedure Statement: G.P.P. 19/Positive Work and Learning Environment

Mr. Fife asked for approval to adopt a new general policy at Franklin County Public Works that was written by the Prosecutor's office. It has been modified for use in the Public Works Department. Mr. Fife said it would give us a tool to deal with a person who may be spreading rumors about other personnel. The policy puts in writing some common sense expectations that you would expect from any employee and gives us a means of dealing with problems through discipline.

Motion – Mr. Miller: I move for approval for the General Policy and Procedure Statement: G.P.P. 19/Positive Work and Learning Environment. Second by Mr. Koch. 2:0 vote in favor. (Exhibit 3)

Mr. Fife said DOE calls this an offset grant. It is basically money to update our solid waste plan, \$45,000 additional funds above what we've been getting to start working on the plan. Mr. Miller is now a member of the Solid Waste Advisory Committee (SWAC). A consultant will be hired to draft the plan.

<u>Motion</u> – Mr. Miller: I move that we accept Resolution 2007-036. Second by Mr. Koch. 2:0 vote in favor.

#### 2007 CRAB Road Levy Certification

Mr. Fife said the certification shows what we're assessing in the rural area for property tax and that we're not assigning any of it to the Sheriff's Department for traffic control. The certification form is required so we can receive our gas tax money.

Motion – Mr. Miller: I move that we have the chairman sign and approve the Certification of the 2007 CRAB Road Levy and Estimated Revenue Produced. Second by Mr. Koch. 2:0 vote in favor. (Exhibit 4)

#### Road discussion

Mr. Fife said the county has three roads that remain closed due to slides at this time. The county is only asking for Federal funding for the R-170 slide at this time. The other two slides occurred many years ago. One slide was on Columbia River Road (commonly called the Haymaker slide). The property owners now use a circuitous route down a 16% grade to get to their homes and property on Fir Road. The other slide was on Basin Hill Road. Mr. Fife feels the Bureau of Reclamation has culpability for the slides. Mr. Fife reviewed the history of some other slides.

Mr. Koch met with Steve DeRuyter regarding access to Juniper Dunes through Mr. DeRuyter's land. Mr. DeRuyter is trying to work with the appropriate governmental agency so access will be available.

The Board also discussed some ideas about the private Peterson Road access.

Mr. Koch asked if a fee could be used for access. Mr. Fife said it could be done on the honor system but there would probably be problems with people trying to get the money out of a box or not paying. Mr. Fife said there are grant programs to improve private roads through some agencies. It is possible the property owners in the Peterson Road area could obtain a grant for improving the road and then allow public access.

Mr. Harder said it is a portion of the old Highway 11-B which was replaced by Highway 260. Mr. Moore showed a copy of a map showing the road. The property description was shown to the Board. Mr. Moore and Mr. Harder met with Public Works staff this morning to request a vacation of the area. There are gates on it but the locks have been removed. People do use it. The railroad has been abandoned.





### **Policy**

The Franklin County Public Works Department (FCPW) encourages open and direct dialogue between employees and supervisors to foster an environment of cooperation in resolution of employee concerns. FCPW intends this open and direct dialogue as a means of promoting a positive work and learning environment for all its employees.

A positive work and learning environment requires that all employees:

- o Receive recognition for personal goals and achievement,
- o Act with respect for self, one another, and property,
- o Deserve to be free from disrespectful conduct,
- o Deserve a supportive environment that brings a sense of belonging,
- o Deserve a safe and secure environment,
- o Accept the responsibility to give and receive trust,
- Are accountable for their actions and are entitled to consistent, fair, and firm discipline,
- o Work as a team member,
- o Act as positive role models,
- o Acknowledge and support the needs of the individual,
- o Receive opportunities for input, challenge, and skill development

FCPW is committed to aspiring to the above-referenced standards as an employer and equally expects such a commitment from all its employees.

If an employee has a concern about another employee's conduct or behavior that is inconsistent with this policy, the employee shall report the matter to the employee's immediate supervisor. Except in discussing a complaint with a supervisor, at no time shall an employee discuss a complaint(s) about another employee in the workplace. Such discussions are deemed to be

contrary to a positive work and learning environment and shall be a violation of the said policy.

FCPW intends this policy to be a benefit to the employer and all its employees. The intended benefits include, but are not limited to, better professional relationships and respect between employees, a clear understanding for employees as to required workplace conduct and expectations, and an outlined procedure for employees to voice concerns or complaints.

FCPW recognizes that for employee complaints to be addressed, a supervisor must be made aware of the complaint. Open and direct dialogue between employee and supervisor allow for matters of which are not conducive to a positive work and learning environment to be promptly addressed, hereby further promoting this policy and its benefits to the FCPW and its employees.
