Commissioners' Proceedings for May 1, 2013

This document is a summarized version of the Board of Commissioners proceedings. The minutes are paraphrased, not verbatim. Access to an electronic audio recording of the meeting is available upon request.

The Honorable Board of Franklin County Commissioners met on the above date. Present for the meeting were Rick Miller, Chairman; Robert E. Koch, Chair Pro Tem; and Brad Peck, Member; Fred Bowen, County Administrator; and Mary Withers, Clerk to the Board. Meeting convened at 9:04 am with the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC HEARING: COMMISSIONER REDISTRICTING

Public Hearing convened at 9:04 am. Present: Commissioners Miller, Koch and Peck; County Administrator Fred Bowen; and Clerk to the Board Mary Withers. Present in audience: Tim Waters, Matt Mahoney, Auditor Matt Beaton and Margo Hines.

The population data on a proposed Commissioner redistricting map is not yet available.

Mr. Miller asked if anyone wanted to testify. There was no response.

Motion – Mr. Koch: Mr. Chairman, I move to move this hearing to a future date after we have map and numbers in hand. Second by Mr. Peck. 3:0 vote in favor.

WSU EXTENSION (9:20 am)

WSU Extension Director Tim Waters met with the Board. Present in audience: Matt Mahoney, Margo Hines and Grant DeJongh.

Department Update

The Youth and Family Regional Extension Specialist position is expected to be filled soon.

Mr. Waters gave an update about the commercial vegetable program. He told the Board about insect management, in particular for a potato pest.

A company is planning to build a new carrot processing plant.

The Columbia Basin region is looking at growing alternative crops, including sweet potatoes that will be processed locally, and carrots, cabbage and red beets that will be used for food dyes.

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PUBLIC WORKS (9:33 am)

Public Works Director Matt Mahoney met with the Board. Present in audience: Margo Hines and Grant DeJongh.

Approval of Local Agency Agreement for CRP 603 Supplement #1 between Franklin County and Washington State Department of Transportation

Motion – Mr. Peck: I move for approval of Local Agency Agreement for CRP 603 Supplement #1 between Franklin County and Washington State Department of Transportation CRP 603 as presented by Mr. Mahoney. Second by Mr. Koch. 3:0 vote in favor. Resolution 2013-162 was approved.

Interlocal Agency Agreement between Franklin County and the City of Pasco

Mr. Mahoney presented the agreement to the Board and explained the changes compared to a previous agreement that was dated August 3, 1998.

Motion – Mr. Peck: I move for approval of Interlocal Cooperative Agreement between Franklin County and City of Pasco through the Department of Public Works. Second by Mr. Koch. 3:0 vote in favor. Resolution 2013-163 was approved.

Approval of award letter to Sherwin Williams for Franklin County 2013 Materials bid for pavement marking paint

<u>Motion</u> – Mr. Peck: I move for approval for the Board of Franklin County approving an award letter to Sherwin Williams for pavement marking paint as presented by Mr. Mahoney. Second by Mr. Koch. 3:0 vote in favor. (Exhibit 1)

Approval of Local Agency Standard Consultant Agreement between Franklin County and Anderson Perry & Associates, Inc., for CRP 604 R-170 Bridge Replacement

The approval of the agreement was postponed until more information is available. **Executive Session** at 9:43 am expected to last 10 minutes pursuant to RCW 42.30.110(1)(b) to consider the real estate acquisition or selection of a site. Grant DeJongh and Margo Hines left the meeting.

Open Session at 9:55 am. Grant DeJongh and Margo Hines joined the audience.

County road/land on Road 97 south of Argent

Motion – Mr. Peck: I solicit the Board's approval for direction to Mr. Mahoney to move forward with an offer to the current property owners in the amount of \$11,300, which is the

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amount provided to us through a professional appraisal that we secured from Mr. Chamberlin, and then ask him to report back to us as to whether or not the current property owner or partial owner – since the county probably owns the land under the road technically – ask him to report back to us and let us know whether the offer has been accepted. Second by Mr. Koch. 3:0 vote in favor.

Associate Engineer

Mr. Mahoney introduced Grant DeJongh who is a new associate engineer in the Public Works Department.

Administrative Assistant Margo Hines met with the Board. Present in audience: Matt Mahoney and Grant DeJongh.

COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR (10:04 am)

County Administrator Fred Bowen met with the Board. Present in audience: Matt Mahoney and Grant DeJongh.

Print Services

Mr. Peck asked Mr. Bowen to research how other counties are handling print services and report back to the Board. He noted that printing services are complex with many different products. One suggestion he made is that it may be possible to bid the services on a discount basis, giving the county a percentage discount on all products and services and in return the county would agree to send its business to the printing establishment.

<u>Motion</u> – Mr. Peck: Mr. Chairman, I move that all bids for print services be rejected as recommended by the County Administrator and direct the County Administrator to notify the bidders and then pursue the direction that we just provided on the record. Second by Mr. Koch. 3:0 vote in favor.

Present in audience: Matt Mahoney, Grant DeJongh, Janet Taylor and Rosie H. Rumsey. Sunset Domestic Water System

Mr. Bowen explained an emergency situation that requires drilling a new well at the Sunset Domestic Water Association which serves 45 residents within Franklin County. The water association used its \$35,000 savings for initial work. The cost of a new well is an additional \$70,000. There may be emergency CDBG grant funding available. The Public Works Department is requesting that the Board declare a state of emergency for Sunset Domestic Water Association and approve the chairman to sign a CDBG imminent threat grant funding application.

<u>Motion</u> – Mr. Peck: Mr. Chairman, I move for approval of the resolution presented by the County Administrator, Declaration of Emergency – Sunset Domestic Water Association Well Collapse. Second by Mr. Koch. 3:0 vote in favor. Resolution 2013-168 was approved.

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Mr. Mahoney and Mr. DeJongh left the audience.

Columbia Basin Development League (CBDL) 2013 membership

The Board had extensive discussion about using county funds for CBDL membership fees and for other agencies that do some lobbying as part of their functions. The Board members all agreed that CBDL provides a valuable economic development service for Franklin County.

<u>Motion</u> - Mr. Peck: I move that we donate \$300 specifically for non-lobbying support to Columbia Basin Development League. Second by Mr. Koch. 3:0 vote in favor.

Executive Session at 10:25 am pursuant to RCW 42.30.110(1)(i) to discuss potential litigation expected to last up to 10 minutes. Ms. Taylor remained in the meeting. Ms. Rumsey left the audience.

Open Session at 10:30 am.

PROSECUTOR

Deputy Prosecutor Janet Taylor and Rosie H. Rumsey met with the Board. No one was present in the audience.

Executive Session at 10:31 am pursuant to RCW 42.30.140(4) to discuss labor negotiations expected to last up to 30 minutes.

Mr. Koch left the meeting at 10:43 am to attend another meeting on county business.

Open Session at 10:48 am. No one was present in the audience.

Adjourned at 10:49 am.
