The Honorable Board of Franklin County Commissioners met on the above date. Present for the meeting were Robert E. Koch, Chairman; Brad Peck, Chair Pro Tem; and Rick Miller, Member; Fred Bowen, County Administrator; and Mary Withers, Clerk to the Board. Meeting convened at 9:00 am with the Pledge of Allegiance.

LEGISLATIVE LIAISON

Lobbyist Jim Potts talked with the Board by speaker phone to give a legislative update. Present in audience: Matt Mahoney, Matthew Rasmussen, Eric Talbott, Roland Thompson and Tri-City Herald Reporter Geoff Folsom.

PUBLIC WORKS

Public Works Director Matt Mahoney and Engineer Matthew Rasmussen met with the Board.

Public Hearing: Vacation of a portion of Dradie Street

Public Hearing convened at 9:12 am. Present: Commissioners Koch, Peck and Miller; County Administrator Fred Bowen; Public Works Director Matt Mahoney; Engineer Matthew Rasmussen; and Clerk to the Board Mary Withers. Present in audience: Eric Talbott, Roland Thompson and <u>Tri-City Herald</u> Reporter Geoff Folsom.

The Board had reviewed the Engineers Report for Vacation of a portion of Dradie Street (Exhibit 1). Mr. Mahoney and Mr. Rasmussen answered the Board's questions. No one in the audience wished to comment.

<u>Motion</u> – Mr. Miller: Mr. Chairman, I move that we approve the final order of vacation for a portion of Dradie Street west of Road 72. Second by Mr. Peck. 3:0 vote in favor. Resolution 2014-027 was approved.

Mr. Mahoney asked for approval of the supplemental agreement as part of the county's request for construction funding for the project.

Second by Mr. Peck. 3:0 vote in favor. Resolution 2014-28 was approved.

AUDITOR (9:26 am)

Auditor Matt Beaton and Director of Accounting Services Tom Westerman met with the Board. Present in audience: Matt Mahoney, Robin Stanco, Jeff Burckhard, Geoff Folsom, Rebeca Gilley, Jerrod MacPherson, Margo Hines, Steve Marks, Richard Lathim and Lester Storms and one other man.

Request for funding for two temporary staff accountants

Mr. Beaton requested approval of funding for two temporary staff accountants, one for payroll coverage and one for the financial software conversion project. He and Mr. Westerman answered the Board's questions including funding sources, length of time the accountants may be needed, prioritization compared to other needs in the Auditor's Office, and work being done by existing staff. There was extensive discussion.

Motion – Mr. Miller moved to approve creation and funding of two temporary staff accounting positions in the Auditor's Office as shown on the resolution. The amount for position one is \$23,224. The amount for position two is \$46,022. Second by Mr. Peck with the understanding the approval is not to exceed that amount. Mr. Miller agreed. Mr. Peck asked that the auditor

Bid opening convened at 9:47 am. Engineers Report for Vacation of A Portion of Dradie Street

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Background

In December 2012 Public Works reviewed a proposed Short Plat (SP2012-14) within the un-incorporated portion of the urban growth area. The plat is located west of the intersection of Road 72 and the dedicated right of way for Dradie Street. The previous owner (Dave Johnson) platted the land (SP2001-02) which created the right of way for Dradie Street as it currently exists. At that time Dradie Street was not improved to County Standards.

The new short plat proposes to extend the right of way for Dradie Street approximately 100 feet to the west and create a new cul-de-sac. As such, portions of the existing cul-de-sac will no longer be a necessary part of the County Road system (Attachment 1).

As a condition of the approval of Short Plat 2012-14 Public Works required that the vacation of these two portions of right of way be completed by the land owner (Mr. Roland Thompson). On December 13th, 2013 Public Works received a completed petition for the vacation of the two portions of right of way. Currently, there are only two land owners that will be impacted by this vacation. Mr. Thompson is the majority land holder. Construction is under way to build Dradie Street to county road standards. Once the Short Plat is recorded and construction of Dradie Street is completed to its final configurations, it will be accepted as a County Road.

Engineers Findings


With the reconfiguration of Dradie Street in Short Plat 2012-14 the left over portions of the existing culde-sac are useless as part of the County Road system. While the vacated areas are not strictly necessary to ensure all lots within the short plat meet minimum lot area requirements (21,780 square feet) the area to be vacated will increase the acreage to lots 1 and 5 of Short Plat 2012-14.

The purposed vacation will have no impact on land owners Mr. and Mrs. Edward Bass (2830 Road 72) and Mr. and Mrs. Roland Thompson (2820 Road 72). Both properties have direct access to the County Road system outside of the vacated area. Mr. & Mrs. Roland Thompson are the majority land holders of the properties adjoining the existing right of way of Dradie Street, and are the party petitioning for the vacation of the excess right of way.

Engineers Recommendation

It is the recommendation of the County Road Engineer that the Board of County Commissioners approve the vacation of these portions of Dradie Street. Once Short Plat 2012-14 is recorded they will be useless as a part of the County Road system. Further their vacation is a direct benefit to the land owner as it increases the useable area of two lots within their proposed subdivision.

WHEREAS, the Auditor's Office Accounting Department has an absence of a key employee (Accounting Coordinator/Recording Supervisor) due to an extended illness, and

WHEREAS, This employee is the lead payroll processing agent for the County and the FLMA leave of absence may continue through April. To cover this absence, a temporary accounting staff employee is necessary for a period of up to six months. Additionally, filling this position

will assist the financial software implementation of payroll and HR by providing resources currently engaged full time with payroll processing; and

WHEREAS, due to the financial software implementation placing a large workload on the Auditor's Office Accounting Department, it has become necessary to hire an additional accountant for a period of up to eleven months to reallocate existing accounting staff to the financial software installation project.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED the Franklin County Board of Commissioners approve the creation of two Temporary Accounting Positions within the County Auditor's Office: (1) Temporary Staff Accounting Assistant, Grade 13, Step 1, and Position (2) Temporary Staff Accountant, Grade 14, Step 1.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners approve to fund Position (1) Temporary Staff Accounting Assistant within Current Expense and Position (2) Temporary Staff Accountant from the FC Capital Projects fund as outlined above.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that in the event the County Auditor is unable to fill the two temporary accounting positions in a timely manner, the Board of Commissioners approve the County Auditor to use contracted accounting services up to the amount approved in this resolution (\$69,246), and to make the transfers into budget lines 41.0060 (Professional Services/Temporary Accounting) and not the salary and benefit line items outlined above within the Current Expense Auditor's Office Department and the FC Capital Projects Fund.
