Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

Commission Chairman Brad Peck called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

9:05 AM Benton Franklin Juvenile Justice Center Electronic Security System Study

Juvenile Administrator Darryl Banks presented resolution 2018-169 to the Board. Mr. Banks stated that the electronic security system in the Juvenile Detention Center is over 20 years old and continues to experience periodic technical difficulties. This system remotely controls the doors, intercom communications and video surveillance within the detention facility and is central to providing a safe and secure environment for both the residing youth and employees.

The Benton-Franklin Juvenile Justice Department notified both Benton and Franklin Counties in February 2018, of the need to do a study of the current electronic security system in the detention wing of the Juvenile Justice Center.

Benton and Franklin County agreed to proceed with an RFQ for firms to study the Juvenile Justice electronic security system. The Review Committee has chosen, and recommends Coffman Engineers to the Boards of Commissioners.

Commissioner Miller moved to approve Resolution 2018-169, Authorizing County Staff to Proceed with Coffman Engineers for the Juvenile Justice Electronic Security System Study. Commissioner Koch seconded and the motion carried.

9:08 AM Proposed Use of .09 Franklin County Economic Development Funds for 2018-2019.

County Administrator Keith Johnson updated the Board on the Franklin County Economic Development Plan adopted in 2017, which requires projects be listed in the Plan's Appendix to be funded.

TRIDEC President Carl Adrian asked the Board for their continued support in the TRIDEC business leads program through, Whitaker and Associates SmartLeads subscription for \$15,000.

City of Pasco Public Works Director Steve Worley asked the Board for their support on the City of Pasco Columbia East Pump Station for \$500,000.
