9:00 a.m. Ben Franklin Transit Presentation

General Manager Gloria Boyce presented a PowerPoint presentation that started with the background history of the Ben Franklin Transit.

- Agency Evolution: Streamlined Routes, New Vehicles, New Technology, New Routes, Extended Service Hours
- 2019 Initiative to Modernize Facilities, Invest in Staff Development and Strategic Planning
- The Future of Transit: Mobility as a Service, Alternative Fuels and Autonomous Vehicles

Brief discussion on buses used for "school tripper" services, electric buses, and reserve funds.

Planning and Building Director Derrick Braaten read the background on preliminary approval of Short Plat 2019-02 to subdivide approximately 26.03 acres. An appeal by Lynn Olsen as to the right to use the proposed access for the new lots being created.

Franklin County Attorney Teresa Chen asked the Board to postpone this hearing a few weeks as she has accepted a position out of the area and would like to give her replacement time to review the documents before weighing in on the matter. Ms. Chen would prefer both parties discuss this and come to an understanding without involving the county.

The Commissioners agreed to give both parties time to discuss this matter and bring it back to the Board if an agreement could not be established.
