### Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

Commission Chairman Robert Koch called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting and Public Hearing to order at 7:00 p.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

## 7:02 p.m. Proposed Use of .09 Economic Development Fund Expenditures for Projects in Franklin County

County Administrator Keith Johnson presented the Board with the proposed for the .09 Economic Development projects.

- City of Pasco Process Water Reuse Facility (PWRF) in the amount of \$500,000
- TRIDEC proposal for their Whitaker and Associates SmartLeads subscription and staff expense in the amount of \$18,000
- City of Connell Rail Interchange project in the amount of \$10,000

Steve Worley from the City of Pasco Public Works responded to questions the Commissioners had on the Process Water Reuse Facility and the foul odor a retaining pond has been discharging for years. After discussion, Mr. Worley agreed to use the funds received to resolve the odor issue as first priority.

Commissioner Peck moved to approve Resolution 2019-148 .09 Economic Development Fund Expenditures for Projects in Franklin County. Commissioner Didier seconded and the motion carried.

### 7:36 p.m. Public Hearing

Preliminary Approval for Short Plat 2019-03 (Appeal 2019-01) from April 30, 2019 Commissioner's Meeting will be postponed until June 4, 2019, to allow parties to discuss an agreement.

### 7:40 p.m. Discussion on Historical Preservation Funds

Administrator Keith Johnson opened the discussion on historical funds as a request from Commissioner Didier. Maisy Stein from the Auditors office put together a booklet that provides a process to receive and distribute Historical funds for the Commissioners to review.

Mr. Johnson has reviewed Benton County's process and deemed it a good role model that Franklin County may wish to incorporate.

After discussion, the Board agreed and gave Mr. Johnson consensus to move forward with a process to initiate a Historic Preservation Advisory Board.

### 7:50 p.m. Discussion on District Boundaries

Administrator Keith Johnson opened the discussion of redistricting as requested from Commissioners. The last update was in 2012 and with the influx of growth; it is time to look into the process of requirements for redistricting in accordance with federal and state voting rights act.

Districts will need to be re-aligned as evenly as possible by population and demographics. The Commissioners gave Mr. Johnson direction to meet with GIS and review numbers and report to the Board.

- Jeffery Robinson thanked a Commissioner for being attentive to the needs of the county employees and supporting law enforcement.
- Matthew Morrell spoke on the moratorium of hemp production. The Commissioner's inquired information from Mr. Morrell as to the laws and requirements of hemp growth.
- Eddy Ochoa supports the right to farm hemp in Franklin County.
- Harold Worsham opposed the expansion of the Process Water Reuse Facility and requested they take care of the odor problem first.
